Application Deadline: February 4, 2015

Apply: Sign up to receive an application from our website as soon as it's available; applications will be available on our website by October 15, 2014.

Deadline: Completed applications must be **February 4, 2015**. Late applications are considered on a space available basis; contact us after the deadline.

Eligibility: Applicants must be American Indian (enrolled), Alaska Native (proof of status) or Native Hawaiian (proof of heritage); maintain a 3.00 GPA (in academic courses) and be in 10th or 11th grade in high school.

Application Components: The application consists of the Student Application & Essay, Teacher & Counselor Recommendations and official transcripts.

Cost of Program: Our program fee is \$450 and includes tuition, room, meals, program materials, and ground transportation to/from the airport to campus. Airfare from student's home to program site is not included but scholarships and financial aid are available for tuition/travel.

Scholarships: Each year 50% of admitted students are awarded tuition and/or travel assistance to attend our programs based on financial need.

Key achievements:

- College Acceptance: Every year, 99% of our alumni go directly to college; 95% typically to four-year institutions with 33% to very selective institutions (those schools that accept 50% applicants or fewer).
- College Graduation: Approximately 85% of our alumni graduate from college within five years.
- Program Facts: Over 2,800 students have attended College Horizons programs to date. Per site, approximately 50 Tribal Nations are represented from over 20 states; 40% are first generation college students; 42% receive need-based financial aid; 70% are female and 30% are male participants. Approximately 40% of our faculty counselors are Native American, Native Hawaiian or Alaska Native.
