November 2020 Ballot Endorsements

[Measure 26-214 – Preschool for All](#) – Multnomah County

- Establishes tuition free preschool
- Raises wages for preschool teachers to be comparable with those of kindergarten teachers
- 1.5% income tax on households with income over \$200,000 and 3% income tax on households with income over \$400,000

[Measure 26-211 – Library Bond](#) – Multnomah County

- Fund renovations and improvements for library facilities in Multnomah County
- Increase space with a focus in East County
- Provides high-speed internet at all libraries
- Property tax of \$.61 per \$1,000 in property value

[Measure 26-218 – Regional Transportation Bond](#) – Metro

- Investments in transit options in the region including MAX lines, free TriMet for youth, a rapid bus network, bike lanes and improvements on existing roads
- Creates ~37,000 new jobs
- Payroll tax on large businesses
 - 9% of businesses impact
 - 91% of businesses exempt

[Measure 26-213 – Portland Parks and Recreation Levy](#) – City of Portland

- Funding will restore recreation, protect natural areas, prevent cuts to maintenance and improve access to Portland's parks
- Property tax at \$.80 per \$1,000 of assessed property value

[Measure 108 – Tobacco Tax Increase](#) – State of Oregon

- Increases tax on a pack of cigarettes by \$2
- Establishes tax on e-cigarettes and vaping products
- 90% of funds generated go to Oregon Health Plan, 10% of funds go to tribal health providers, Urban Indian health programs, regional health equity coalitions and culturally specific health programs
- Would raise \$111 million in the current biennium
